DEAR PARISHIONERS

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The second person of the Holy Trinity became man so that we could be in union with God for all eternity. God who is beyond all understanding took on our flesh and blood. God is now tangible to our senses. Through the precious Body and Blood of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist we can have God's blood coursing through our veins and sanctifying our lives.

Today, after the 10:30 Mass, we will take the precious Body and Blood of Jesus Christ present in the Eucharist through our neighborhood in a Eucharistic procession. We will make four stops for a brief reading and blessing. This is symbolically taking Christ to the four corners of the world. Not only is this a wonderful way to fulfill our mission to take the Gospel to the ends of the earth, it is also a powerful way to be with Jesus in a very special moment. This procession is a witness to the world of our faith in Jesus Christ and a chance to strengthen our faith by taking it to the world.

Today the Totus Tuus program starts for our school age children and high school students. Please pray for the team that provides this program and the students enrolled. This is a wonderful one-week program that helps deepen the knowledge and love of Christ Jesus.

This month our work will begin with M.E.R.C.Y. communities. This is a local ministry that has helped dozens of single mothers move from homelessness or unemployment to a steady working and living environment. We are teaming up with Christ the King and St. Agnes parishes to sponsor a family for a two-year period. During this two-year period mentors will help them through training to become self-sufficient in the working world.

Our first obligation will be to provide the items needed to furnish and supply a two-bedroom apartment. We already have many items. We will have a sign-up sheet available for donations after Mass. Please check to see if you will be able to donate any of the items that are still needed.

Last Saturday, May 29th, two men were ordained to the priesthood for our diocese. Fr. Steve Thompson and Fr. Paul Kala. Cardinal George from Chicago ordained them here in our Cathedral. It was a very moving liturgy and we now have the gift of two more priests for our diocese. The joy of this gift is tempered by the fact that at least two of our priests are now retiring for health reasons. One of them is very ill. Neither of them is able to do parish work anymore. This emphasizes the need to pray for the success of our diocesan pastoral planning work and an increase in vocations to the priesthood for our own diocese. Please continue to pray also for bishop-elect Thomas Paprocki.
